



**DISTANCE LEARNING SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM
GRADES 9 THROUGH 12
JUNE 8 – JUNE 26, 2020
Registration deadline is noon on Wednesday, June 3, 2020**

***2020 Summer School is ONLY for students enrolled at Gateway College Prep, Gateway Tech, or Kingsland School.**

DISTANCE LEARNING: All courses are self-paced utilizing the GradPoint computer-based curriculum. Students will work on courses at home with scheduled Zoom check-ins from summer school teachers. Students are expected to take notes while working through all lessons and complete all their own work. At-home adult proctors are required to monitor tests. Parents and students need to sign and return the procedures on p. 2 of the registration.

The fee is a **\$75 per semester course**. Students will be enrolled in one semester course at a time. Students will only be enrolled in a second course after completion of the first course. The deadline to enroll in a new course is noon on **Monday, June 22**. Students may take up to a maximum of 3 semester courses during summer school. Refunds will only be issued **PRIOR** to the student starting a course. All fees need to be paid **BEFORE** credit can be issued for summer school courses.

Payments will be made electronically through the Frontline (formally TEAMS) Parent Portal. Once registration is received, summer school course fees will be added to your Frontline (formally TEAMS) Parent Portal account within 5 business days. In Frontline Parent Portal, parents will *go to the* tab titled “unpaid fees” displayed for each child where payments can be made using debit or credit card.

CREDIT RECOVERY COURSES: *Provides students who have failed a course during the regular school year an opportunity to make-up the credit during summer school. Students may recover credits toward graduation requirements through computer-based instruction.*

CREDIT FOR ACCELERATION: *Provides students with the opportunity to take select courses without having any prior instruction in these courses. Students must meet course prerequisites.*

Incomplete course(s) at the end of the three-week session will not earn credit. Students may not work on courses after June 26, 2020. Incomplete courses can be continued at the start of the next school year.

Orenda Distance Learning Summer School Procedures Summer 2020

Parents AND students will acknowledge each of these procedures when registering for summer school.

- Students are enrolled in one course at a time as determined by summer school registration documentation. Students can register to take up to 3 courses during summer school, but may not begin a new course later than Monday, June 22, 2020.
- Students are expected to take notes while they are completing lessons and show work in math (practice problems as well as quizzes and tests.) A note-taking template/guide is available for them to assist with taking efficient notes. Students are required to show their work in math before they answer questions to quizzes and tests. Students are expected to access [khanacademy.org](https://www.khanacademy.org) for additional help in math and science.
- Plagiarism or copying someone else's work is not allowed and will result in a zero for that assignment/quiz/test. This includes going to websites for answers during a quiz or test and also creating and using an answer guide to refer to while taking the quiz or test. Sharing of information with other students is prohibited.
- Students are given 2 opportunities to take unit tests. If they make less than an 80 on the first attempt, a second attempt is required and school staff must be notified to reset the test. Due to distance learning constraints, parents are being asked to monitor their student(s) during tests. By signing this document, parents are agreeing that their student has taken appropriate and relevant notes and that they are going to monitor their student during the test itself. Should a student need a second attempt on a test, they will be required to schedule a ZOOM meeting with school staff before the test will be reset and available to the student.
- Students are expected to log at least 20 hours per week in GradPoint on their coursework to make sufficient progress. A week is from Sunday through Saturday.
